## *From the Principal*

Dear Parents,

The holy season of Advent began on November 27. We celebrate Advent and Christmas every year. Do we take the time to reflect on God's presence among us? How prepared are we each day to celebrate the Kingdom of God? The days of Advent help us to prepare for Christmas, the celebration of the birth of Jesus. We are reminded of God's faithfulness and of how deeply committed He is to us. Advent is a time filled with God's grace when we are invited to reflect deeply on His love for us and on His presence to us. May we find many opportunities during the next four weeks to grow in our relationship with God. During these weeks many things like candles, lights, trees, decorations, cards, gifts remind us of the secular aspects of Christmas. We are challenged to center our lives and hearts on Jesus, the reason for our celebrations.

One of the symbols of Advent is the Advent wreath. It symbolizes our longing for the coming of Christ. The wreath is a circle of evergreen branches into which are set four candles, usually three are violet and one is pink. May the light of the candles of Advent remind us that Jesus is the "light of the world". He comes into our darkness with the light of His love, His joy and His peace. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.

The committee of teachers planned Advent activities. The Advent traditions used with the students during the daily morning prayer include the Advent wreath and the Jesse Tree. Each classroom will set up their Advent wreath. The Advent wreath set up in the school on the hallway reminds us of the four weeks of Advent. The students will remember some of the key figures who prepared for the coming of Jesus by placing the symbols on the Jesse Tree. Our daily prayer in the mornings will center on people like Abraham, Isaiah, Jonah, David, Solomon, Jacob, Elizabeth, John the Baptist, Joseph, and Mary. I encourage you at home to google the Jesse Tree and have your child be reminded of some of the key figures who prepared for the coming of Jesus. Students from all grades will participate in the morning prayer, according to the schedule given to the teachers.

The schedule of Advent activities was sent home in November. Students have opportunities to dress in Christmas colored clothing, sweaters, Christmas socks and pajamas. I'm sure they will like the Grinch day. Thank you to the families whose children already sent in their manger made of recycled materials. They are very creative, and beautiful. Classrooms are also using the "My Friend Gnome" box which is a similar idea to the Elf on the shelf but using a gnome. Students will also be engaged in Advent bingo. Clues will be given each day during morning/afternoon announcements. Each classroom will have a board and work as a team to determine if they have the answer to a clue on their board. Thank you to the teachers who planned all of the Advent activities in this wonderful season of hope.

One of the projects that our students and families will be working on during Advent is giving gifts to families in need. This is done through the Parish Outreach. This is coordinated through Parents' Guild. Students are encouraged to do good deeds during Advent.

One of the fundraisers sponsored by Parents' Guild is the "Monday Blues". The children may participate in this for \$20 per child or \$40 per family, and wear jeans on the first Mondays of the months, with the next being December 5. Students may wear jeans, khaki pants, cargo pants, or sweatpants (or shorts depending on the season). Jeans must not have holes or slits in them. They should not be tight fitting. No pajama bottoms may be worn. Leggings cannot be worn as a stand-alone bottom. T-shirts or sweatshirts with inappropriate sayings and/or pictures are prohibited. All casual/dress down clothing must look neat, be free of rips, holes, or tears, and must be school appropriate. Clothing should not be tight fitting. Clothing must remain modest, and be neat in appearance. No tight fitting or revealing clothing (i.e. leggings or short shorts) should be worn.

Thank you to all the parents who help in our school in so many ways—the homeroom parents, the family who counts box tops, the parents who volunteer as lunch monitors, the parents who help with various activities for the students, the parents who are the Parents' Guild officers. Thank you to our coaches! Thank you to the parents who attend the meetings of the Parents Guild. If you have not attended, please consider attending future meetings.

We are very grateful for the work and advice of our School Board. Thank you to the chair of Santa's Shop and for the parents and the grade eight students who assisted the children in grades Pre K through five in making the crafts. Thank you to Mrs. Warren for organizing the "Reading Challenge" for the classrooms during the month of November. Thank you to the families and students for making reading a priority. Congratulations to the two students who tied as top readers in the school by reading 6010 pages each---J. Britton (Gr. 5), and F. Wypych (Gr. 6). Students in grades 3 and 5 are the top two classes who read the most. They will be going on Dec. 6 to the Buffalo Bills Stadium for a tour and a tailgate lunch. Let's continue to read!!

Thank you to the families who supported the Thanksgiving Food Drive for Feed Hamburg in later October and early November. This food drive was organized by a few students in Gr. 6 and 8.

Thank you for your attendance at the in-person Parents' Guild meeting on November 15. The next Parents' Guild meeting is on January 10 at 6:30p.m.

Students in grades 3-8 will celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the school day on December 5. Picture retakes are done on December 6.

We celebrate the holyday of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary on December 8. This is the Patronal Feastday of the USA. Mary was filled with God's grace. God continues to pour out His grace in abundance upon all of us. May we be open to this gift of grace as Mary was. We can learn so much from the life of Mary, our Mother. Let us rejoice and thank God for the model of Mary, a woman of faith and trust. Our faculty and students will attend Mass on December 8.

I remind everyone that Parent Teacher Conferences take place on December 12. Parents were able to sign up in September or on "sign-up genius" for Middle School. If you still need to schedule a conference, please contact your child's homeroom teacher. It is important that parents are aware of their child's work as seen on the Parent Portal. Many teachers e-mail parents about the work that needs to be handed in for specific subjects.

We acknowledge students who practice the virtues and values that are designated for each month. The Catholic Schools received information from the Diocesan office in regard to the character program. Traits are set for each month. The trait for September was "welcoming", October's was "sportsmanship", November's was "service" and December's is "appreciation". A short video is available on the Diocesan website showing how the trait for the month can become a part of the school culture. Each school is asked to nominate a student at the end of the month for the Character Award. One of those chosen from the classrooms for our Student of the Month recognition will have their name sent to the Diocese. The student from each grade level who has the chance to be chosen from the school for the Diocesan Award will receive the Student of the Month Award at SSPP.

These certificates will be presented to students at the end of a Mass celebration close to the end of each month. The SSPP Students of the Month for November and December will receive their certificate at the end of the Mass celebration in December. Parents of the November and December Students of the Month will be informed when those certificates will be presented to the students.

Six of our Middle School students are participating in the Diocese of Buffalo Catholic Schools Math League. This is the first year this event is taking place. The competition was to take place on Nov. 18, but was postponed to December 2 because of the snow event.

Some students in Gr. 8 were accepted to participate in the Leadership programs at Mt. Mercy Academy and at Bishop Timon-St. Jude H.S. There are four course dates during this school year, with the first being in mid November.

Our school is participating in the Buffalo Catholic Schools Spelling Bee. The class spelling bee competitions and school finals need to take place before the Christmas break. The top three students from SSPP will enter the Diocesan Spelling Bee finals Competition on Jan. 30 at Mt. St. Mary Academy. This is the first year this event is taking place.

Dismissal on Dec. 21 is at 11:20 a.m. Christmas break is from December 22-Jan. 2. Classes resume on January 3.

The faculty, staff and I extend to you and your family wishes for a peaceful Advent, a blessed and joy-filled Christmas, and a New Year 2023 filled with many graces.
